1209 Twin Lakes Leadville RD DC Oakes School	August 8 – 15 Phil Smith 303-688-9638	This Crew filled primarily by DC Oakes High School Students: Crew will finish and open a new section of Trail north of Twin Lakes. Elevation 9,400 ft. CT Segment 11.
1309 Animas River Columbine RD	August 8 – 15 Ernie Norris 970-375-9738	Backpack with Train Support: The Durango & Silverton Railroad will assist with this remote camp. Work will be to replace a small bridge and build a temporary Trail where a landslide crossed the Trail last year. Elevation 9,000 ft. CT Segment 24.
1409 Janet's Cabin Dillon RD	Sept. 12 – 19 Ernie Werren 970-262-2549	Backpack: We will pack into Janet's Cabin above Copper Mountain to work on the Trail in this area. This is a great place to stay courtesy of the Summit Huts Association. Elevation 11,600 ft. CT Segment 8.

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JOIN US: We'll train you. The Colorado Trail Foundation invites you to join us for one or more of our worthwhile Trail Crews. Everyone is welcome—we promise lots of fun, rewarding work, fresh air and new friends!

OVERVIEW: To work on a Trail Crew, you must be at least 16 years of age and in good physical condition. You bring your sleeping bag, pad, tent, eating utensils, work clothes and personal items. The Colorado Trail Foundation provides food, cooking and group camping equipment, training, trail work tools and leadership.

TEAMWORK: Trail Crews are highly participatory. Volunteers team up to accomplish trail improvements and share tasks of setting up camp, meal preparation, and enjoying the evening campfire.

SCHEDULE: Volunteers on week-long Crews typically meet early Saturday afternoon and are responsible for their own transportation to the meeting place. On Sunday there is a training session with an introduction to trail work and safety. Crews work each day except Wednesday, which is free for recreation. On Saturday, departing Crews help pack up the equipment if the camp needs to be moved.

COST: The week-long crew fee is \$50 and weekend is \$25. Volunteers may participate in additional crews at no additional cost – see the registration form.

This project was started last year and we will finish it this year through an open meadow full of wildflowers. Elevation 7,600 ft. CT Segment 2.
0209 Squaw Creek Bridge & Maint. Salida RD	June 20 – 27 John Lipe 303-814-3744	Drive-in: Camp in a beautiful meadow overlooking the Arkansas Valley. We will build a small bridge over Squaw Creek and improve the Trail in this area. Elevation 9,500 ft. CT Segment 14.
0309 Kenosha Pass South Park RD	June 20 – 27 Cindy Johnson 303-987-3225	Drive-in: Camp in a nice, well protected area near Kenosha Pass. Work will be to complete improvements to the Trail east of the pass. Elevation 10,000 ft. CT Segment 5.
0409 Lost Park South Park RD	June 27 – July 4 Tom Brooksher 303-694-1676	Jeep-in: Camp and work in a beautiful secluded valley. Improve the Trail where it climbs to the top of the park, building drainage structures and installing culverts. Elevation 10,000 ft. CT Segment 4.
0509 Clear Creek Leadville RD	July 11 – 18 Phil Smith 303-688-9638	Drive-in: Camp near fast-flowing Clear Creek. We will improve the CT on the hillside south of the new bridge. Great fishing near camp on your day off. Elevation 9,000 ft. CT Segment 12.
0609 Cataract Ridge Divide RD	July 13 – 17 Jody Petersen Dave Peters 970-247-8386	Backpack: This 5 day crew will work on the new Cataract Ridge Trail doing necessary work north of Stoney Pass. You must be in very good shape for this one as it involves some hard hiking and serious work at high elevations. Elevation 12,600 ft. CT Segment 24.
0709 Raspberry Gulch Salida RD	July 18 – 25 Glenn Kepler 303-278-7795	Drive-in: Camp in beautiful meadows and improve the Trail from Raspberry Gulch north. Great views of the Arkansas Valley. Close to the Mt. Princeton Hot Springs. Elevation 9,500 ft. CT Segment 14.
0809 Miners Creek Dillon RD	July 18 – 25 Merle McDonald 719-599-4258	Jeep-in: Camp at the worksite in a nice meadow high in the trees. We will build a new bridge and boardwalk and do some other CT repairs. Elevation 10,600 ft. CT Segment 7.

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
